Report on the Village Hall Expansion Project



In August we broke ground on the extension and the old lean-to store came down and work began. The project was funded by a combination of Section 106 monies donated by local developers, a Community Chest grant from Aylesbury Vale District Council and some of the reserves from the village hall funds.

The concept was to add a second usable meeting room, better kitchenette and a proper storage space. We did this by getting planning permission to replace the lean-to store with a proper building. We also added an outside store for the garden stuff and so what was the kitchen became the new store room. We also made it all on the same level so getting chairs and tables in and out wouldn't be such a chore.

One casualty of the work was the rowan tree in the garden which had to be felled as the roots were under the new building. We have saved the wood from the tree and hope to make some memorial objects from it including a plaque commemorating the new extension.

Much of the village hall has a flat roof and when building work was underway we discovered the old roof, especially the section over the toilets and entrance lobby were only a few years away from failing so we took the decision to replace all this at the same time.



Internally we are now complete, all bar some finishing touches. The room has already proved its worth as we are able to accommodate the 4th May Council Elections Polling Station in the new room while keeping existing bookings running in the main hall.



There is a little landscaping to be done to get the garden back to its normal condition but we hope to be OK for the Mentmore Arts Festival.

WALKING THE PARISH FOOTPATHS: MEN 8/1 (Bridleway)

This path takes you round the edge of part of Mentmore Golf Course, currently not in use, starting just below the thatched Cheddington Lodge on the road to Cheddington and finishing at Crafton Lodge at the lower end of Crafton. From beginning to end and back again will take you approximately an hour at a reasonably brisk pace.

The bridleway is signed from the road at Cheddington Lodge and leads straight through an opening onto the course along a tarmac drive. At the first bend, leave the road and continue forward along a wide track (way marked). The track runs straight between a flat cultivated field on the left, with Westend Hill in Cheddington visible in the distance, and the golf course on the right. Along the golf course you will see a planted border of small trees such as cherry and birch interspersed with other deciduous woodland trees, with here and there the odd evergreen.

After about ¹/₄ mile, after passing the golf club maintenance sheds, leave the track (not currently waymarked) and plunge right, into the wooded area which fringes the path from this point. If you find yourself at a sharp left hand bend on the main track, you have overshot the official footpath.

For the remainder of the walk, the path meanders through the wood with glimpses of the undulating contours of the golf course to the right. To start with, the woods are strewn with fallen branches and dead vegetation which give an air of neglect, though they seem to cheer up as you proceed. There are signs of a more ordered past with sections of iron railings and a scattering of untended box plants, normally associated with gardens and trim hedging. Overhung with trees, the path may be muddy but can be delightfully shady in the heat of summer. The footpath finishes at Crafton Lodge where a last muddy flourish leads you through a gate and onto the road at lower Crafton.

DONATE A GATE

Walkers alert! It has been proposed to replace the stile adjacent to Vicarage Cottage, Mentmore with a kissing gate to make the footpath more accessible to dog walkers etc. The work of replacement will be handled by the volunteers of North Bucks rRipple (ramblers Repairing & Improving Public Paths for Leisure & Exercise). However we need to find about £250, the cost of the gate itself. The Parish Council is willing to make a contribution. If you have an interest in keeping public footpaths open for all, please consider making a small donation.

SUPERFAST FIBRE BROADBAND

During a recent visit, by a representative from BT Open Reach, discussions ensued as to how soon we might expect to have superfast broadband, via fibre, in Mentmore. The representative recommended that as many people as possible register their interest online, as this will help Open Reach establish demand and may prompt earlier activation of Mentmore's upgrade. Superfast broadband is already at Cheddington, less than 2 miles away, and a "box" has apparently already been installed here, so it's all about numbers.

WILDLIFE UPDATES



Bucks Owl & Raptor Group www.giveahoot.org.uk

BORG We are approaching that time of year when our resident tawny owls are finding new homes in readiness for the breeding season (of the species we monitor they are usually the first to nest). Other owls and raptors breed later in the spring, but they too will be assessing boxes and natural nest sites, so our first phase of box checking will take place in a month or so.

As always, it would be helpful to know if there are any owls or other raptors in the area. So, if you see any of the species we're monitoring please do let me know where, and when, you saw them. We have already had regular sightings of buzzard and red kite (although these are not within our remit), with less frequent sightings of barn owl, kestrel, sparrowhawk and little owl.

Please do remember though, that any unlicensed disturbance of these species at or near their nest sites is illegal and can lead to prosecution under the Wildlife & Countryside Act.
