



## VILLAGE HALL NEWS



## **NEWS FROM ST. MARY'S CHURCH**

*PARISH OF CHEDDINGTON WITH MENTMORE*

Thank you to everyone who so generously responded to my last article revealing the difficult financial position St Mary's is in. Over £2,000 has been freely given to date; a wonderful response, and there are one or two fundraising events in the pipeline too! In addition we received a fabulous £2,250, from the Mentmore Arts Festival, for which we are extremely grateful. We are still not out of the difficulties, and the long term future of the church does need to be addressed, but I am encouraged by the response from villagers – which is much appreciated. I am interested in hearing any ideas you may have for the use of the church – for example, if you would like Sunday services at different times on the day, or different styles of service – I would like to know. (I can't promise anything!) My thinking is that the long term future for St Mary's has to lie in using the beautiful space in creative ways, not just on Sundays, but mid-week too.

This summer we held a Christian Creative Arts Retreat at St Mary's on four Wednesday mornings (10-1); it was a toe dip, following on the heels of the Arts Festival. Led by two artists, one of whom is also a professional dancer, and hosted by myself, the retreat created space for artists and interested individuals to meet with God through their own art, journaling or simple contemplation. People came from Crafton, Mentmore, Leighton Buzzard, Chesham, Cheddington and Berkhamsted. Everyone brought their own materials with which to work; nobody was obliged to do or share anything they didn't want to. It was special. Prayer at the beginning led into a time of guided meditation/creativity, giving us space to explore our "inner artist". Each morning was different. We were given tools to engage with, and listen to, God – some familiar, some new. It was great! We tapped into our inner lives, discovered more of what it is to be fully human and creative members of a creative Universe. We gave expression to what was moving within us as we thought, prayed, wrote (poetry or prose), drew and painted - and one morning we even danced the Lord's Prayer! I can only speak for myself: as we gave time to God, we met with God, and our souls were nourished. We also blessed one another, the church and the people of Mentmore, Crafton and Ledburn - so we hope you are feeling the effects...and now we are considering what the next step might be...

In the meantime, you might like to come to St Mary's Harvest Festival on 2<sup>nd</sup> October, at 11.30 am, followed by a bring-and-share lunch, an opportunity to thank God for his provision and goodness and generosity to us, to pray for local farmers and for the needy in the world. The offering this year will go to the Archbishop's Mustard Seed Project – helping people in the UK overcome debt.

### FOOTPATH WALK MEN/13/1, MEN/12/1

These two footpaths, which both start in Crafton and finish on the Leighton Road, can be linked using 300 yards or so of the Leighton Road. Each section can be walked independently. The whole circuit, or more accurately rectangle, takes less than half an hour to walk from start to finish.

Beginning at the junction between the lower and upper parts of Crafton where there is space to park by the noticeboard if needed (keeping the gateway clear), walk up the road to the right, ignoring the first footpath sign. Footpath MEN/13/1 starts at Little Chapel Farm, a short distance into Crafton on the right after the post box. The way is indicated by a sign on the side of the building at this point and the path takes you directly through the farm yard and gardens and a series of four gates and stiles. You will see a pond to your left before you find yourself on a mown grassy path running between a fence and a hedgerow. Stiles are waymarked, so that you can be sure you have not strayed. It is advisable to keep any dogs on a lead until you emerge into a field after about five minutes. Cross diagonally aiming for the pylon ahead, and a hedgerow.

Walk down the right hand side of the hedge, continuing in the same direction. You will not have a choice about this, although hidden in the undergrowth at this point is a bridge across into the next field which would bring you to the other side of the hedge, waymarked as the correct side from the road at the far end. The bridge is no longer passable (B.C.C. aware). Once you arrive at the end of the hedge, and reach the road, this section is nearly complete.

If you wish to continue, you need to negotiate the ditch to the left, into the adjoining field and walk a short distance to the left, parallel to the road. At a gap in the hedge, after the second tree, cross onto the road at a disused field gate. This is not visible until you reach it, but is waymarked from the road. By walking the paths this way round, you can now link up with MEN/12/1 by walking along the road to the right, facing the (fast-moving) traffic. It is possible, though not comfortable, to walk on the verge to avoid the traffic.

The next section of the walk is also waymarked from the road and is quite straightforward. Just beyond the field gate is a gap in the hedge, currently rather overgrown with a bridge over the ditch which takes you into the field. Walk along the edge of the field, straight up the left hand side of the hedge. You will find straight lines to be quite a feature of this part of the walk, crop lines and hedges, criss-crossed by pylons and telegraph cables, with roads running along three sides of the field.

Nearing the far side of the field, the path bends slightly to the right. Go through the well-worn gap in the hedge to find yourself within a few yards of your starting point.
