WILDLIFE NEWS

It has been an unusual few months, with mild temperatures and record rainfall – both of which are playing havoc with the normal day to day life of not only us humans, but our local wildlife too!

Unfortunately, I have not been around much to see what has happening, but recently have had numerous sightings of Chinese Water Deer, Muntjac, displaying Buzzards, Red Kite, Barn Owl, Little Owl and Kestrel. Garden birds too are reappearing in greater numbers, so for those of you with nest boxes do keep a look out, as they will soon be making their nesting choices for the forthcoming breeding season.

The weird weather has led to several instances of early nesting including, the recently reported Mistle Thrush, seen nesting in of a set of traffic lights in Leeds city centre and three young Tawny Owl chicks taken to St Tiggys in early February – both a good month earlier than one would normally expect!!

NEWS FROM ST. MARY'S CHURCH

Dear Friends

It is a pleasure to introduce myself in writing after my wife Anna and I moved into Cheddington vicarage just before Christmas. It was, as you might imagine, interesting to begin a new post at such a time of the year and it was good to have an opportunity to meet a

lot of people in quick succession. Having now had our settling in period, we look forward to getting to know you better over the year that I am licensed to this post.

Having served in a variety of settings in the past, including a curacy post in Yorkshire, a number of years in Paris as a chaplain in the so-called 'Diocese in Europe', and a spell as a university chaplain, it will be a new experience to be an interim minister in this rural context, and I hope we can all work together to try and ensure a good base for whoever else may be appointed to the local team ministry over the next twelve to eighteen months.

Being without a vicar for 20 months inevitably means that people have had to rally around to keep things going in the vacancy, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank both Lin, the churchwarden, and Mike, our local retired priest who I am sure will be known to many of you, for their hard work during the interregnum. It would be great to develop and nurture a whole team of people who may be able to help or offer their expertise in various ways. I would already like to extend a vote of thanks to all who have helped with the upkeep of the churchyard – a big and important job. Many thanks also for the support and welcome of the people of St Mary's who have cared for the place and done what is necessary to keep the church afloat.

I am gradually working out how to apportion the various opportunities and responsibilities of an interim post, which extend both within and beyond Cheddington and Mentmore and into the wider area of the Cottesloe team.

It was good to meet some of you in the village hall already and I hope to meet more of you more fully as things develop. As to a couple of things I can already draw your attention to, I will be running a Lent course in the area of faith, personality and psychology on the first four Monday evenings in March. These will be in the Methodist church in Cheddington and start at 7:30pm. There is also a full programme of Holy Week services being provided in the run up to Easter and it would be great to see some of you at those. On the social front there are also some quiz evenings coming up, as I became fond of organizing such events in my Paris years and aim to keep this going! ST MARY'S CHURCHYARD - Caring for God's Acre

Our working party was unable to meet on 29th February as planned due to the wild, wet and windy weather. However, a small group of us met later to carry out the important task of installing four bird boxes. As we know, the birds will not wait.

In October, we resumed our monthly Saturday morning sessions of cutting, trimming, slashing and burning brash, in an attempt to reclaim the area from brambles, ivy and nettles. In January we were rewarded with lovely colonies of snowdrops and now primroses, making their way back amongst the gravestones. We anticipate a later display of woodland flowers, such as wood anemones after the work we have done. Once the birds start nesting, we will leave them in peace until the autumn.

If you would like to join the working party, just come along, even if you can only spare a little time and would just like to see what we are doing. You will be very welcome. The next session will be on Saturday 21st March 10am - 1pm.


