**ST MARY'S CHURCHYARD:** Our season of work parties in St Mary's churchyard started in October, the group managed to get the important work of reclaiming the grave stones, box trees and yew trees from the invasion of ivy and brambles started, but it is a long and difficult task.

Despite the weather, an enthusiastic group of volunteers gathered on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> November to once again take up arms against the ivy and nettles in the churchyard. The ivy posed the biggest challenge, with some of the branches more than 8 ins. in diameter. With the right equipment and a great deal of determination we freed most of the box trees and rescued some of the yews.

We started the removal of the nettles, which take over the mound to the rear of the church. The ground was softened by recent rain and made pulling up much of the growth easier – but there is still a lot of work needed! The two rose bush holes were filled, one with a buddleia in a pot, the gutter down pipes were cleared of leaves, one of the drains on the north east side of the church was blocked and will be reported to the P.C.C. as it needs clearing.

All in all with a coffee and a delicious piece of shortbread and chocolate brownie the team were well rewarded and very satisfied with the work accomplished.

It was agreed that the yew and box will need further remedial work in the spring, but if we can remove all the remaining ivy and bramble before then we will be able to make a real difference to future maintenance of the church yard. Just a word of warning to all those keen gardeners amongst you be vigilant when it comes to removing ivy it is a pernicious invader and will take over and kill all other plants!

As the festive season is approaching and preparations for Christmas are taking up most peoples' time, I am proposing our next work party be held Saturday 4th January. We will continue the work and hope to have a bonfire to clear some of the more persistent rubbish. Hope you can come.

This allows for a log to be created of the issue and also generates a reference number for follow-up of the issue, plus allows for some details to be logged when the problem is reported to help with prioritising the issue.

### DOMESTIC RECYCLING

Christmas Waste - don't forget you can still recycle most items including:

- Christmas Cards (but not foil or glitter ones)
- Paper plates and napkins (unsoiled)
- Paper crackers, hats, card inners (but not snap)
- Clean aluminium foil
- Wrapping paper and gift tags (remove bows and ribbons first)
- Card packaging
- Chocolate tins and plastic tubs
- Wrap turkey carcass in old newspaper and put straight in the food waste bin



## IN MEMORIAM

It is with sadness that we announce the passing of; Caryl Huntley, Jean Howlett and Graham Dunmall.

# **Caryl Huntly** (19?? – 2019)

It is with great sadness that we have to report that Caryl died in October. Caryl had lived in Mentmore with Gordon her husband (who died in 2011) for well over thirty years. Caryl loved Mentmore and was much involved in the village as a contributor and benefactor - particularly in the early days of the History Society. Many residents will remember Caryl zooming around in her beloved MGB and will also remember her and Gordon's renowned hospitality and long evenings of fine wine, dining and laughter!

Caryl will be sorely missed by many.

# **Jean Howlett** (1932? - 2019)

Sadly, Jean died on 10<sup>th</sup> October after a short illness (although she had suffered from health and mobility issues for some time). She spent most of her 86 years in the village of Ledburn and as a child walked to Mentmore to school every day. She is now laid to rest near her parents (Bayliss) in St Mary's churchyard. As a child Jean attended the church and was often asked to operate the pump for getting the air through the organ pipes. Indeed, we have lost a great link to the past in this area.

An excellent cook, Jean worked for various pubs and restaurants and later used her baking skills for the benefit of the church and the village. Jean was a hard worker and with fewer family demands when her children were grown-up she turned to the church and was a church warden for many years, in fact as long as her health permitted. A much-loved woman of strong faith, Jean will be sorely missed.

Jean was the salt of the earth and was loved by everyone who knew her. She was well respected and had many friends. Jean made a massive impact on St Mary's. She was churchwarden for many years most of which were on her own. She took her role very seriously and ensured the correct running of St Mary's and of course looked after the parishioners and hardly missed a church meeting. Nothing was too menial for her to take on, in addition to her CW role, she cleaned the church on her own, provided flowers for Sunday services, did the catering and refreshments. When she retired from CW she continued with the catering and the refreshments after services, and always had her finger on the pulse until her illness prevented her from doing so. She was too ill to attend the Harvest Festival this year but still provided food for the lunch, testament to the type of person she was. She worked tirelessly for St Mary's and always gave advice to those who sought it. It was a privilege to have her as a very close friend. She will be greatly missed by us all.
